A discussion was then had on the value of school box video was shown.

As part of a conversation around unity of purpose, Board members were then asked (without discussion) what perceage of District students are succeeding. Answers ranged from 37 to 80%. The meaning of success was then discussed, and the Board was asked what decisions they feel contributed the most to student achievement this year. The Brown discussed what they hoped would be major improvements over the next 10 years.
